

 An ecosystem is at its core a community of living organisms taken together in their physical environment; it describes the way these components interact and are interdepended. All of these parts, alive and inanimate, depend on each other within the ecosystem even when they are not directly connected.





What is a Learning Ecosystem?



 A learning ecosystem describes an approach to building a learning environment that intentionally and holistically weaves together learning opportunities, resources, data, and people in the physical and virtual world to support and encourage continuous improvement and growth.



- Course was updated to provide resources and exercises digitally to enhance overall learner experience






9614: Federal Grants Management for JVSG Recipients

- Course was updated to provide resources and exercises digitally to enhance the overall learner experience


9617: Federal Grants Management for HVRP Recipients

9639: DVOP Specialist Skills Refresher and Cross-Training


- Updated exercises to better align with the DVOP specialists' role and responsibilities
- Updated content and structure to match 9608 course updates






9610: Career Coaching for Special Populations Courses

 - Include videos, self-paced lessons, and discussions in MCHV:CoP









Development and Pilot of 9610: Career Coaching for Special Populations: Serving Veterans with Substance Use Disorders


- Provides demographic and statistical information about veterans and substance use
- Prepares veteran service providers to assist veteran clients with substance use disorders in acquiring employment and necessary services





Development and Pilot of 9611: Welcome to Your Role as State Veteran Coordinator: SVC 101

- Provides guidance to new SVCs on their roles and responsibilities
- Prepares new SVCs for their role by reviewing promising practices and challenges associated with their position using gamification and discussion










Development of 9612: Addressing Burnout in Veteran Service Providers

- Will pilot in FY 2024
- Defines burnout and differentiates it from secondary trauma
- Emphasized self-reflection and strategies for preventing burnout, while also offering strategies for overcoming burnout



Making Careers Happen for Veterans: CoP (MCHV: CoP)

- Reorganized to improve the user experience in February 2022
 - New topic and sub-topic folders
 - Resources for DOL VETS Grantees
 - Serving Veterans and Eligible Spouses
 - Working with Employers to Promote Veteran Employment

 - Recommended NVTI courses related to the topics






Career Roadmap Certificate Program






Journey Maps


